According to our Bylaws...

Section 7.2 Election of Officers

In the spring, the Past President forms and chairs a Nominating Committee from the membership for the ensuing year. At the final meeting of the fiscal year, the Past President presents the slate to the membership and asks if there are further nominations, provided that prior consent of nominees have been obtained. A simple majority by the members present is sufficient for adoption. Successor Officers assume their duties after the change over meeting, or by June 1. In the event an incoming or outgoing Officer cannot attend the change over meeting, it is incumbent upon them to meet as soon as possible so that the exchange of the Officer's Duties Bylaws binder is effected. Officers may be elected to serve on the Board for more than one term but are elected each year.

May 13th will be our final General Meeting (AND Drew Bandish Demo afterwards.) Please plan to attend and bring your Job Duties Binders given to you at the beginning of last term.

Paul Strahm

AN DIEGO-based plein air painter, Paul Strahm, gave a talk to our membership at the RB Library for our April 8th general meeting. Paul talked about his love of painting and how he came to be an internationally recognized artist.



Strahm's passion for painting began when he was young, as did his love for the outdoors. His rural Ohio upbringing allowed him to intimately explore nature on his family's country farm. After high school, Paul attended Youngstown State University where he studied art and became fascinated with the French Impressionist painter, Paul Cezanne. Cezanne's study of nature — through his paintings — influenced Strahm and he began to emulate Cezanne's natural hues and his love of "plein air" painting. Not long after receiving his fine arts degree in painting, Paul moved west to San Diego, a climate very similar to Cezanne's favorite haunts in the south of France. Thank you, Paul, for a very enlightening talk.
