Anne focused her presentation on the **power of contrasting colors**—how intentional color choices can energize a piece, create depth, and guide the viewer's eye.

Working from a drawing, Anne demonstrated her process step by step, talking through her decisions in an **easy-going, conversational style** that members found both engaging and approachable. Her relaxed manner encouraged questions and made the demonstration feel more like a shared exploration than a formal lecture.



To everyone's delight, Anne **gave away the two pieces she created** during the demonstration, adding an extra spark of excitement to an already enjoyable event. Members left inspired, with fresh ideas about color contrast and a renewed appreciation for how bold choices can transform a work of art.


Janet Keto

A WEEK IN THE DESERT

February 2026

"Paint the Desert" January 2026 was the 5th annual California Desert Plein Air Festival spearheaded by founder Diane Moore and co-founder Daniel Foster of the Desert Plein Air Association (DPAA), with the goal to become the west's premier plein air festival. After my experience, I believe it is setting the festival standard.

If you haven't attended a festival before, let me tempt you with an accounting of my week in Palm Desert.

Our group of eight San Diegans stayed connected via text, sharing where we'd be painting on a given day, while keeping expectations loose. The DPAA wisely scheduled four daily paint-out locations from Saturday through Tuesday. On Saturday, the first day, I joined the DPAA location at the ...

art. Painting together makes friendships easy.

The desert had gotten a lot of rain, and this made the landscape verdant. I was astounded by the view of the mountains, the light shift and variety of colors. Being slow to catch on, I finally realized that all vantage points in this landscape come with a view of the mountains. Something you already know, if you've been to this region...it is literally surrounded by mountain views.

That first painting took the longest, as I worked out how to shape the mountains with fewer brushstrokes.

Indian Canyon DPAA scheduled El Paseo Shopping district for Day 2. The San Diegan contingent mostly went to Murray Trailhead in Indian Canyon. There's an oasis of palm trees and a huge slab rock. With a view of the mountains behind. It's so stunning I had trouble settling down to paint. I hiked the area and finally set up after a couple of hours. But with an overwhelming plethora of subject choices my focus was gone, and my unsalvageable painting shows it.

On day three we chose to paint at the DPAA location, Ironwood Park. Because the daily DPAA locations are posted, the art-loving community came to the events specifically to see us paint.

Over the 6 days I painted, I chatted with the public, giving out over 100 postcards of my work, especially to children.

Living Desert Zoo and Gardens

The DPAA arranged to give festival artists free entry to the zoo on day four. We San Diegans have high standards when it comes to zoos, and we were all impressed with this beautiful space. Some of their 12 giraffes were standing dramatically at the hilltop with a backdrop of mountains, the pond reflecting like a mirror. It was the opposite experience of Indian Canyon.

Sunnyland Botanical Gardens


On day 5 we submitted one painting per artist to the Artist's Council Gallery, an impressive, light-filled space. The DPAA left us on our own to choose painting locations; they had a show to hang. We enjoyed the gardens of Sunnylands, painting the profusion of wildflowers in the foreground of the ubiquitous mountains.

My painting buddies and I had made plans to paint the Prescott Preserve on day 6, but I woke up thinking about the resort, sitting by the pool with an adult slushy. So, they pressed on while I toiled in a lounge chair with my paints. I was too lazy to order that slushy, as it turns out.



The reception was in the evening, and it was quite posh, with over 300 people in attendance.

\$15,000 was given in prizes, and the work in the exhibit was outstanding.

The concurrent student show winners garnered \$50 bills along with their recognition. San Diegan Geoffrey Allen impressively won 2 awards.
